Europe is recognizable worldwide for its rich cultural values including intangible cultural heritage (ICH) - the knowledge, practices and traditions of European citizens. The importance of ICH was legally recognized with the Convention for the Safeguarding of the ICH adopted by UNESCO General Conference in 2003. Cultural heritage is a value in itself that builds national self-confidence and a sense of belonging to a region, country and part of the world, but, in addittion, the safeguarding of the ICH contributes to different aspects of sustainable development of different regions in Europe - remote, rural and also urban territories.

The 8 experienced organisations of seven European countries - Latvia (Ethnic Culture Centre Suiti Foundation), Estonia (Kihnu Cultural Space Foundation and NGO Setomaa Tourism), The Republic of North Macedonia (ICTM National Committee of Macedonia), Georgia (Georgian Arts and Culture Center), Italy (UNIVERSITA DEGLI STUDI DI CAGLIARI), Croatia (Gacko pucko otvoreno uciliste Otocac) and Portugal (Munícipio de Idanha-a-Nova) - representing different cultural values recognised by UNESCO - have created a partnership, supported by many associated partners - to join forces and share experience from several countries in order to provide better understanding of what are the best ways and methods to channel the knowledge to those who need it - people practising UNESCO included traditions. Most of these partners have cooperated before, including Erasmus+ programme Startegic partnerships project.

Project partners are of different size and scope, yet they share similar aims and target groups. Practitioners of the ICH elements as well as staff of participating organisations are direct project target groups. All organisations have long-term experience of working with them in each country and impelementing various, national and EU co-financed projects. The main project objective will be achieved by different activities.

In order to exchange methods, approaches and best practices among participating organizations and countries, seven Short-term joint staff training events are envisaged to take place in all partner countries with diverse program to give participants a comprehensive picture of the situation in each country in the field of ICH.

During the course of the project, it is expected to develop several outputs:

1. The Summary of methodologies and approaches working with target groups of all partners;

2. Joint good practise examples booklet.

The developed materials will be made printable and available online for public at the project partners' web sites free of charge.



Ethnic Culture Centre Suiti Foundation will oversee the overall management and implementation of project activities by all project partner organisations. It is also envisaged that each partner organisation will set up a local project management team. Issues pertaining to project implementation and achievement of expected project results are planned to be discussed with partners during five transnational project meetings.

Various dissemination activities are also envisaged, including local seminars in 6 partner countries and conference in Latvia where project results will be presented to a broader audience. In addition, it is also planned to make use of social media (Facebook, Instagram, Twitter) and partners' web sites to inform all stakeholders about achievements in the project and to promote the developed materials.

The education of practitioners of ICH will be improved directly through such project activities as created educational materials, conference and seminars, but also indirectly - through capacity building of the partner organisations - adult educators. As a result of the training events staff of the partner organisations - adult educators - will gain fresh ideas, different perspectives and exchange methodology and approaches. Impact on partnering organisations is expected as well: opportunity to network at a transnational level, exchange of best practice supporting organisational learning. Due to the different project partners the project will also provide an opportunity to draw conclusions on the role that cultural heritage can play within sustainable rural and urban development. Cultural heritage and sustainable cultural tourism contributes to improved income and job opportunities. The project has a direct beneficial effect to safeguarding and promotion of European cultural heritage.

The network of UNESCO united organisations will give the unique opportunity to join different people from very different countries and cultures to promote significant part of European cultural heritage. The public authorities in the field of ICH, organisations (adult educators) and practitioners of ICH as well as many associated project partners working in the field of ICH - stakeholders at all levels- will be involved in one large network. This approach is innovative in the field of ICH.

Background and Experience

NGO Ethnic Culture Centre "Suiti" was established on 2002. Its aim is to promote and develop different aspects of Suiti cultural heritage and to promote the local economy based on traditional culture activities (culture tourism, local crafts etc.).

ECC Suiti was mainly responsible for preparation the application to Unesco for including Suiti cultural space to Unesco List of Intangible Cultural Heritage in Need of Urgent Safeguarding, which was successfully approved in October 2009. ((https://ich.unesco.org/en/USL/suiti-cultural-space-00314). In addition to the application the safeguarding measures (a programme) were developed in order to preserve and promote Suiti culture among target groups of all ages. Educational activities (from pre-school children to seniors) are the most important part of this programme.

It is organizations task to find the balance between development, promotion, preservation and protection of Suiti cultural heritage. People of Suiti region (~2500) of all ages are direct target goup of ECC Suiti activities. NGO has around 50 members, including all three municipalities locating in Suiti region (Alsunga, Kuldiga, Ventspils). These municipalities support the financing of most of foundation's projects. They will ensure the pre-financing and, if neccessary, the co-financing for this project as well. Members of the foundation are involved in educational activities - some as paid staff (permanent - 2 persons but implementing the projects - ~10-15 persons during the year) but most as volunteers.

Ethnic Culture Centre "Suiti" is responsible for organizing "Bourdon (Drone-singing) Festival" which takes place in every 3 years and is visited by many participants from Latvia and abroad.

The organization has implemented many European Union co-financed projects and national projects financed by Latvia, which has enabled to organize events introducing and promoting Suiti heritage culture (like Bourdon Festival etc), including as a Coordinating partner Erasmus+ programme Strategic Partneships project "The Network of UNESCO recognised values" (2018-2020).

In recent years the activities of ECC Suiti have been co-financed by the Ministry of Culture of the Republic of Latvia.

Since 2002 ECC Suiti has implemented countless projects to preserve and promote Suiti culture and since 2009 when it was included in UNESCO list a lot has been achieved. But the existence of culture is still endangered due to a decrease in local population. Therefore foundation pays great attention to support activities which contributes to the development of the local economy based on traditional culture.

Foundation as a Coordinating partner implemented Erasmus+ programme Strategic Partneships project "The Network of UNESCO recognised values" (2018 - 2020), project partners were from Estonia, Georgia and North Macedonia. ECC Suiti was also one of the partnes in EU Interreg Est-Lat project "UNESCO- Tourism" in co-operation with several Latvian municipalities and partners from Estonia, including Kihnu Cultural Space Foundation (2017-2020). From 2012-2014 ECC Suiti participated in implementation of Est-Lat project "Seto-Suiti Renaissance" in co-operation with Alsunga municipality and Seto Institute. In addition foundation regularly implements EU co-financed LEADER projects from 2011-2017 to improve the foundation's premises and equipment and to organise different activities.

The organization has also implemented many national projects financed by Latvia, which has enabled to organize events introducing and promoting Suiti heritage culture (like Bourdon Festival, concerts, traditional crafts workshops etc).

Foundation's project manager Māra Rozentāle has had large previous expierence in project management and financing for many years – working as a Head of Development Department and Deputy Head of Finance Department of Alsunga Municipality as well as experience in different NGO's since 2009 – as a project manager and accountant. Māra Rozentāle has experience of national and European Union co-financed projects and measures, including projects of European Development Fund, European Social Fund, European Commission Lifelong Learning programmes, several Erasmus+ programme projects in different organisations (2 projects as a Coordinating partner) etc. In this project Māra Rozentāle will be project manager.

Chairman of the Board of the foundation Dace Martinova is the leader of the organisation for 11 years and has large experience working with EU and state financed projects. In this project Dace Martinova will be project manager's assistant.

Kihnu cultural space was included to the Unesco list of heritage culture masterpieces in 2003. Kihnu Cultural Space Foundation was established in the same year with the aim to preserve and restore the tangible and intangible Kihnu cultural heritage. In 2008 Kihnu cultural space was included to the Unesco list of intangible cultural heritage ((https://ich.unesco.org/en/RL/kihnu-cultural-space-00042).

Organization is involving to its activities all people who are part of Kihnu culture heritage and use it in their everyday life (~530 people in Kihnu island and ~40 - in Manija island). Special attention is paid at young people encouraging them to use local language and to learn heritage culture of Kihnu and Manija islands. Thus, in addition to preserving traditional values, Kihnu Cultural Space is responsible for development local folk culture in the islands.

Kihnu Cultural Space Foundation has long experience in organizing different kind of heritage culture events in Kihnu and Manija islands, which have attracted many visitors from Estonia and abroad. Organization participated actively in implementation of Kihnu Cultural Programme in co-operation with Kihnu municipality and Estonian Ministry of Culture. Organization has experience in implementation several national and EU funded projects related to the development of Kihnu heritage culture centre and arrangement of heritage culture events.

Two persons are working in the organisation all year and 4-5 employees during the summer season.

Organization participated actively in implementation of Kihnu Cultural Programme in co-operation with Kihnu municipality and Estonian Ministry of Culture.

Organization has experience in implementation several national and EU funded projects related to the development of Kihnu heritage culture centre and arrangement of heritage culture events. Foundation is currently implementing Est-Lat project "UNESCO- Tourism" in co-operation with several Estonian municipalities and partners from Latvia, including Ethnic Culture Centre Suiti Foundation.

GACC for almost 20 years works for the preservation and sustainable use of tengible and intengible heritage of Georgia; The activites of GACC's two main programmes: (a) Safeguarding of Georgian Cultural Heritage and (b) Development of Cultural Industries are focused on the one hand towards the development of the studies and methodologies for the safeguarding of Georgian heritage and on the other hand finding the sustainable ways of its livelihood and transmission to the new generations. In 2012-2016 Center elaborated and implemented consistent measures for the preservation of traditional skills of craftsmenship, one of important intengible legacy of Georgia. Through elaboration of study methodology, work out of reccommendations and provision of action plan GACC achaived substancial positive shift in the sector, that can serve as an successful case for other fields of intengible heritage. In 2016 GACC efforts in the transmission of Heritage crafts skills to the new generations and public awareness activities were awarded EU Prize for Cultural Heritage / Europa Nostra Awards 2017 for the project "Tengible side of Intengible Heritage"

Since 2008, when the Canto a tenore, Sardinian pastoral song has been inscribed on the Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity (originally proclaimed in 2005), ethnomusicologists of the University of Cagliari have been directly involved in both studying and actively collaborating with Regional institutions such as ISRE (Sardinian Regional Institute of Ethnography) and traditional singers' associations to safeguard this Intangible Cultural Heritage.

The research activity of the University of Cagliari Unit in the field of ethnomusicology and ICH move along three main lines.

1: Creation and development of the LABIMUS Archive, aimed to find, acquire, digitize and analyze recordings of Sardinian traditional music.

2: Ethnographic research that aims to analyse the effects that the process of "restitution" of sound documents kept in the archives connected bears on the practice of contemporary performers, such as (re)construction of musical practices based on historical recordings and strategies and policies of (re)functionalization put in place by musicians and other social actors.

3. Through an interdisciplinary investigation in which historical, ethnographic and historical-musicological research converge, we study the patrimonialization processes of Sardinian music of oral tradition.

The person in charge of the University of Cagliari for what concern this project will be prof. Marco Lutzu, Lecturer of Ethnomusicology at the University of Cagliari. He gained his PhD in 'History and Analysis of Musical Cultures' in 2013 (University of Rome 'La Sapienza'). He has carried out fieldwork in Sardinia, Cuba, and Equatorial Guinea, focusing on the relationship between music and religion, improvised poetry, hip hop culture, and performance analysis. He is the scientific director of the Encyclopedia of Sardinian Music (L'Unione Sarda).

The different courses, trainings and seminars that the NGO organizes are meant not only for the members of the NGO, but for all members of the community. In 2016-2018 Setomaa Tourism organized a detailed training program for the guides of the area, which was a big success and invaluable experience for both organizers and the attendees.

Setomaa Tourism has vast experience in involving and empowering people in the field of tourism, entrepreneurship, identity-building. It works in close cooperation with other umbrella organizations, such as Seto Institute, Union of Setomaa, Union of Seto Craftsmen, the local museums, municipality institutions as well as with tourism entrepreneurs and other members of the community. Setomaa Tourism represents Setomaa enterpreneurs with local and international unions and tourism professionals.

Setomaa Tourism is known in the community for its focussed and dedicated work and highly appreciated organizer of trainings, seminars etc. The NGO also has experience in international cooperation. In 2017-2020 the NGO was the lead partner of a very extensive EST-LAT project called "UNESCO-tourism" (see section below).



What are the activities and experience of the organisation in the areas relevant for this project? What are the skills and/or expertise of key persons involved in this project? Please explain how the organisation brings an essential added value to the project.

Setomaa Tourism NGO is one of the most important and active NGO-s of the Setomaa region. It works to make Setomaa as a destination stronger and more visible. One of the key activities is to empower the local people – those creating the living community. It is of utmost importance that the local people value their unique heritage. It is important for the community and identity, but also from the tourism aspect. Therefore, Setomaa Tourism has contributed a lot in empowering the people by organizing multiple study trips, workshops, seminars, trends, if needed laws and inputs etc. All these have helped the people to become more aware about the uniqueness of the cultural heritage of the area, and have encouraged them to widen the scope of businesses and services they are offering.

Nowadays, when traditional singing is not only part of everyday life, but is also seen as a service offered to tourists. Setomaa Tourism is the main partner for many local Leelo choirs, providing them opportunity to present the Seto Leelo to guests from all over the world. For people living in a marginal rural area of the country, this extra income from tourism is very important.

One of the most recent projects of the Setomaa Tourism NGO was the EST-LAT Interreg project "Development and promotion of small ethno-cultural regions as tourism destinations", with Setomaa Tourism being the lead partner among 12 partners. This long and very productive project gave the NGO invaluable experience in managing big projects and helped to bring the local tourism entrepreneurs to work together, focusing on the special cultural values of the region.

Helen Külvik (b. 1975, PhD), the project leader, is herself an active practitioner of Seto Leelo. She has been a member of the Mokornulga Leelo choir since its foundation in 2008. She was the main organizer of the world's first Seto Leelo Conference in 2009. She is an active member of the Setomaa Tourism NGO, and is employed part-time in the Seto Institute. She is also engaged in tourism business, working as a tour guide offering cultural tours to tourists from very different regions of the world. Helen has previous experience in being a project leader for Setomaa Tourism, she was the project leader for the 2-year tour-guide training program. Helen has been providing input for most of the published materials of Setomaa Tourism in recent years (website, leaflets, marketing stories). She is an active author for the local newspaper "Setomaa", with the main aim to disseminate information about different on-going projects to the people of Setomaa.

Elin Priks (b. 1979, MSc), the board member/manager of the Setomaa Tourism NGO, has worked for Setomaa Tourism since April 2017, manager and the board member. She has vast experience both local and foreign travel trade representatives and co-operation with different press representatives. She has been working in governmental VisitEstonia team as a foreign market representative (Latvia, Lithuania, Poland, UK, USA and Japan) and working in destination marketing 12 years.

Kadri Moppel (b. 1984, BA) has been working as a project manager in Setomaa Tourism from 2018. She is finishing a master's degree (2020) in service design and management. Kadri works also in the Development Center of Võru County as a tourism coordinator from 2016. Kadri is promoting Võru county local tourism entrepreneurs and sights and is working tightly in promoting the smoke sauna tradition of Võrumaa as the UNESCO ICH item.

Heli Koit-Meriluht (b. 1968), the office manager of the Setomaa Tourism NGO, is also an active practitioner of Seto Leelo. She is a member of the Värska Women's Leelo choir. She has been employed in Setomaa Tourism since 2012.

Background and Experience

Gacko pucko otvoreno učilište Otočac /acronym GPOU Otočac /is a public institution for culture and education founded in 1962. The institution dates back to the original name of the National University "Marko Orešković" Otočac and the Otočac People's University, which is the founder of the City of Otočac. Today's name of the institution is in line with the 1997. Law on Open Institutions. It operates in a building that is a monument of culture of national importance and which has been in power since 1986. It is owned by the Croatian Parliament. Since the establishment of the institution to this day, GPOU Otočac has been confirmed as a guardian and promoter of local cultural and historical heritage and cultural specialities, and participates in the marking of all significant dates in the social life of the City of Otocac and its surroundings. Except for its own regular activity GPOU Otočac gives its space to other entities, whether individual events are organized independently or in cooperation with GPOU Otočac. The Gacka Museum operates as part of the GPOU Otočac, where valuable materials and documentation of the past and present of the Gacka region and the city of Otocac are kept and presented. Today, the Gacka Museum consists of the Archaeological Collection, Archaeological Japodska Collection, Ethnographic Collection, Cultural and Historical Collection, Art Collection, Stojan Aralic Memorial Collection and Historical Collection. GPOU Otočac nurtures cultural and artistic amateurism. Folklore society Otočac operates at the institution and brings together 80 members of all ages arranged into four groups : the original traditional group, tamburitza group, folklore group and children's group. In addition to the folklore society in the GPOU Otočac is also operated by the Tamburaski Orchestra with 25 members, the Arupium Amateur Theatre with about 15 members and the Children's Drama Group with 10 members. The content of its activities has been expanded by the university with the establishment of the Children's Singing Choir, which has been operating since 2009. In the GPOU Otočac, teaching and education is performed in the playing of wire musical instruments and planos according to the program of the primary music school, and verification is done in cooperation with the Music School Vienceslav Novak from Seni. As part of educational activities, workshops, seminars and lectures and other educational facilities are organized. In the GPOU Otočac shows theatrical and other performances. Writers and scholars come to guests carers of cultural and artistic amateurism, diverse artists and numerous names from Croatian cultural life. The GPOU Otocac work programme is determined by financial means and divided by activities. Since the City of Otočac is the founder of GPOU Otočac, the City Council confirms the work programme GPOU Otočac and participates in the financing of the program and ensures the salaries of employees, provides some of the material costs and material rights of employees while the rest of the material costs and investment maintenance of the building is provided from the state budget on the basis of the ownership of the Croatian Parliament over the building. In the GPOU Otočac has a total of eight permanent employees. For the realization of individual activities, the GPOU Otočac engages external associates through work contracts. In addition to the city budget, activities and individual programmes were financed through appropriations of the Ministry of Culture, the county budget and own resources generated from the activities of GPOU Otočac.



What are the activities and experience of the organisation in the areas relevant for this project? What are the skills and/or expertise of key persons involved in this project? Please explain how the organisation brings an essential added value to the project.

For the years, Gacko pučko otvoreno učilište Otočac is a leading organizer of the traditional dancing and singing activities. It all started with the organization of the county festival of Dinaric dances and songs followed up with the organization of numerous folk societies supported by a series of workshops and other aspects of counseling and assistance. Otočac and Gacka/Lika region are situated in the Dinaric hinterland region an heirdom of the various archaic singing and dancing genres. One of them is Ojkanje singing, performed by two or more singers (male or female) using a distinctive voice-shaking a technique created by the throat. Ojkanje owes its survival to organized groups of local tradition bearers who continue to transmit the skills and knowledge, representing their villages at festivals in Croatia and around the world. (https://ich.unesco.org/en/USL/ojkanje-singing-00320) Distinctive traditional dance tradition of the area is also UNESCO recognized tradition. Nijemo kolo (silent dance) is a tradition of the Dinaric hinterland area. (https://ich.unesco.org/en/RL/nijemo-kolo-silent-circle-dance-of-the-dalmatian-hinterland-00359)

The Gacka/Lika region is borderline with an interesting Adriatic/Mediterranean archaic singing tradition such as two-part singing in the Istrian scale (https://ich.unesco.org/en/RL/twopart-singing-and-playing-in-the-istrian-scale-00231) or klapa singing (https://ich.unesco.org/en/RL/klapa-multipart-singing-of-dalmatia-southern-croatia-00746). On the other hand, newer layers of the traditional singing in Lika is deeply influenced by bećarac, the most popular newer traditional singing form as well recognized by UNESCO (https://ich.unesco.org/en/RL/becarac-singing-and-playing-from-eastern-croatia-00358).

Thanks to the activities of the Gacko pučko otvoreno učilište, many traditional vocal groups and village folklore groups started practicing and presenting their own dance and singing tradition. For most of them, it was the only opportunity to present their tradition outside their community. Their activity inspired a new generation of singers and dancers for the search of older layers of their music and dance tradition. Gacko pučko otvoreno učilište Otočac has been at the forefront of these changes for years. It is a meeting point for the traditional keepers and researchers, a place where both sides have the opportunity to collaborate and exchange their knowledge. "Učilište" is also encouraging vocal groups outside the region who perform older singing tradition to explore a vast treasure of singing traditions of the Gacka/Lika region. One of the most prominent is the ensemble Harmony of Dissonance. The Harmony of Dissonance ensemble, consisting of eleven singers, grew out of an eponymous project that started in October 2016 at the Academy of Music in Zagreb. It is a project conceived by Mojca Piškor, PhD, and the current art director, Joško Ćaleta PhD, as a meeting point for students of the Academy of Music and skilled singers of traditional music. The initial idea of bridging the gap between the worlds of academic and traditional musicians, opened up the space of learning, trying and creating music together.

Professional associate, organizer of cultural programs, Vera Dasović born in Otocac in 1968. At the Pedagogical Faculty in Rijeka she graduated in 1990. Worked at the United Nations from 1992 to 1994. Head of the Otočac Folk Society, children's drama group, mixed singing group and children's singing choir. She has been employed in the GPOU Otočac since 2009. As an employee of the Gacko pučko otvoreno učilište Otočac, she is the organizer of the traditional Dinaric zone seminar. The seminar includes Dinaric songs and dances. This seminar is extremely popular throughout the Republic of Croatia and abroad. The leaders of folklore groups participate in the seminar. For the fourth year in a row, the total number of participants is from 110 to 130. In this way, the cultural heritage and tradition of songs and dances are preserved.

Ass. Prof. Dr. Joško Ćaleta (Trogir, 1964) is a research associate at the Institute for Ethnology and Folklore Research in Zagreb and an assistant professor at the Music Academy and the Institute for Church Music of the Catholic Theological Faculty in Zagreb. He graduated music pedagogy from the University of Split gained his master thesis from the University of British Columbia in Vancouver (Canada), and a PhD from the Department of Musicology at the Music Academy in Zagreb.

Besides to scholarly research, mainly focused on the music practice of Dalmatia and Dalmatian hinterland, he has directed his work towards the application of scholarly knowledge and the transfer of musical knowledge as a music author, ensemble conductor and a member of expert committees of numerous folklore festivals and governmental bodies. He participated in the elaboration of several proposals for the protection of ICH at national and internation levels.

Background and Experience

Please briefly present the organisation/group (e.g. its type, scope of work, areas of activity and if applicable, approximate number of paid/unpaid staff, learners and members of the group).

The Municipality of Idanha-a-Nova administrates a largely rural area of 1.416 km2 in central Portugal. In Idanha-a-Nova (Idanha), we have always rejected the idea that rurality is just a term for isolation and underdevelopment. This is a place where tradition coexists with innovation and modernity. Idanha's heritage is worldwide noticed: UNESCO Creative City in the field of music since December 2015, Biosphere Reserve in 2016 and part of the Geopark Naturtejo da Meseta Meridional since 2006 - the first Geopark in Portugal and the first UNESCO classification in the region. Idanha is a UNESCO territory, combining tangible and intangible heritages, and this recognition is the validation of a path, an incentive to continue the good practices that sustains it.

The Raiano Cultural Centre is the head structure in the municipality's cultural strategy, carrying out research and performative projects, tourism and arts support. Special attention is given to ICH features within the local communities and local groups, responsible for the well-kept rich heritage of traditional music and knowhow, orally transmitted. One of the best examples of the joint work done with local population is the undergoing application of the Easter Cycle in Idanha-a-Nova to the UNESCO best safeguarding practices.

Since the late 1990's, the Municipality has made a serious investment in the cultural area, supporting research regarding its local ICH, promoting arts and cultural programming within the local communities and sharing good practices combining tradition and modernity, aiming for a sustainable development of the scarcely populated region. This became a territorial feature and a reference, both in Portugal and abroad.

In 2015, the municipality became member of the Strasbourg Club, an informal network of European cities towards cultural, environmental and social cooperation; and, in 2016, Idanha was selected to represent Portugal as the invited country for the annual Christmas Fair – the oldest in Europe -, developing a wide programme that included performances, concerts, exhibitions and a Portuguese products market.

The municipality team includes staff from the municipality, mainly related to the Raiano Cultural Center, from several areas: history, archeology, anthropology, curatorship, heritage conservation, tourism and social intervention. Related to this project will be able to involve about 6-7 of our staff members.

Within the municipality's cultural environment, the number of possible partners includes a wide range of personalities and associations, with whom we usually cooperate through the multiple initiatives taking place here. At the present there can be listed about 90 of them.

The municipality of Idanha-a-Nova has a clear development strategy and commitment towards the sustainability of its cultural heritage, that includes undertaking ICH projects as a means to increase international cooperation, exchange of knowledge and sharing good practices. Idanha's heritage is worldwide noticed: UNESCO Creative City in the field of music since December 2015, Biosphere Reserve in 2016 and part of the Geopark Naturtejo da Meseta Meridional since 2006 - the first Geopark in Portugal and the first UNESCO classification in the region.

Manager/ Technical Paulo Longo has a degree in Anthropology from the Institute of Business and Labour Sciences (ISCTE), and a post-grad in Territorial Marketing from the Beira Interior University (UBI). He has held a permanent position with the Idanha-a-Nova town council since 2004, where he is involved with ICH research, museology, curating exhibitions in Portugal and abroad, ethnographic illustration, editing, programming cultural events and local development. At present, he is responsible for the Division of Education, Social Action, Culture, Tourism, Sport and Leisure in the Idanha-a-Nova town council. The main objective of the project is to promote the education of adult educators working in the field of intangible cultural heritage (ICH) of seven European countries (Latvia, Estonia, The Republic of North Macedonia, Portugal, Italy, Croatia and Erasmus + Partners country Georgia) as well as the education of bearers of UNESCO-related elements thus safeguarding and promoting these European cultural values. Cultural heritage is a value in itself that builds national self-confidence and a sense of belonging to a region, country and part of the world, but, in addittion, the safeguarding of the ICH contributes to different aspects of sustainable development of rural regions in Europe. Due to the different project partners the project will also provide an opportunity to draw conclusions on the role that cultural heritage can play within sustainable urban development. Cultural heritage and sustainable cultural tourism contributes to improved income and job opportunities both in rural and urban areas. Please explain the context and the objectives of your project as well as the needs and target groups to be addressed. Why should this project be carried out transnationally?

The main objective of the project is to promote the education of adult educators working in the field of ICH of seven European countries as well as the education of practitioners of UNESCO-related elements thus safeguarding and promoting these European cultural values. This project will be a logical continuation of the Erasmus + programme project "The Network of UNESCO recognised values" where four of this project partners were involved and which focused on musical heritage in partner countries. New project will give the opportunity to expand the existing network, by attracting new partners and to explore other UNESCO-recognised values in all partner countries. The main task of the project is to explore the best ways and methods to channel the knowledge to those who need it - people practising UNESCO included traditions. In total the project is addressed to two main target groups: Staff of the partner organisations- adult educators- and practitioners of the ICH elements in partner countries. LATVIA: ECC Suiti main task is to preserve Suiti Cultural Space which since 2009 is included in UNESCO list of ICH. People of Suiti region (~2500) of all ages are direct target goup of ECC Suiti activities. Many local Suiti people are involved in preserving of these traditions both in their families on a daily basis and also joining in different groups. ESTONIA: Kihnu Cultural Space was included in UNESCO list of ICH in 2008. People of Kihnu cultural space (~700) of all ages are direct target group of NGO's activities. Most recognizible elements of Kihnu traditional culture are musical traditions. local dialect. national clothes, also local food. As in the Suiti region, number of local population is small and decreasing, thus the existence of the culture is really endangered. GEORGIA: GACC works for the safeguarding of both tangible and intangible heritage of Georgia. Its staff, unofficial members and volunteers act in the different fields like handicrafts, traditional music, folk dances as well as preservation and conservation of the monuments and cultural landscapes. It is estimated that most of the population of Georgia are involved in safeguarding their UNESCO- included ICH traditions such as Georgian polyphony singing, vine making and other. However, the preservation of traditions is also threatened here, due to globalization. NORTH MACEDONIA: The National Committee of The ICTM of Macedonia Skopje aims to preserve the cultural heritage of Republic of Macedonia. In the project it will represent UNESCO-included values: Glasoechko, male two-part singing in Dolni Polog, Kopachkata, a social dance from the village of Dramche, Pijanec and other. The practitioners of these elements in Dramche, Delchevo, Jegunovce and other places are diret target group. ITALY: UNIVERSITA DEGLI STUDI DI CAGLIARI (University of Cagliari). Since 2008, when the Canto a tenore. Sardinian pastoral song has been inscribed on the UNESCO list of the ICH, ethnomusicologists of the University of Cagliari have been directly involved in both studying and actively collaborating with Regional institutions and traditional singers' associations to safeguard this heritage. A tenore singers and people living in the area where this music is widespread (approximately 50-60 villages in the central area of the Sardegna island) are the direct target group. ESTONIA: NGO's Setomaa Tourism key activities are to empower the local Seto people to preserve their distinguishing cultural heritage (musical heritage, language, clothes, cuisine etc.) especially Seto Leelo, Seto polyphonic singing tradition which since 2009 is included in UNESCO list of ICH. Seto people (~12 000) are main NGO's target group. CROATIA: Gacko pucko otvoreno uciliste Otocac is a public institution for culture and education and promoter of local cultural and historical heritage. Institution organises various activities to promote such UNESCO-recognised values as Ojkanje singing, Two-part singing and playing in the Istrian scale and other. People of Otočač city and region (~13000) are direct institution's target group. Due to emigration and increasingly older population the preservation of traditions is endangered. PORTUGAL: Munícipio de Idanha-a-Nova is a member of UNESCO Creative cities network since 2015. As a Creative City of Music, Idanha-a-Nova envisages to organise various activities in order to foster an inclusive and sustainable educational offering through an integrated learning experience for the population of city (~9000). Detailed description of target groups is in attachement (Word file).

This project should be carried out transnationally rather than on national level because of the wide variety of educational organizations for adult learning which will add new perspectives and approaches to those which already exist at a national level. Project partners have been active in their field for many years, so they are aware of the situation at national level.



What results are expected during the project and on its completion?

Project results: - seven Short-term joint staff training events organised with 192 mobilities in total (plus local participants from host organisations); each 4 days long (plus 2 days for traveling); in order to share experiences, methods and approaches among partner organisations and countries in the field of ICH;, - five Transnational project meetings organised (16 participants in each meeting), four of them organised together with staff training events, to discuss project management issues; - educational materials created for target groups - practitioners of ICH, staff of partner organisations and other stakeholders, prepared together by all project partners: 1. The Summary of methodologies and approaches working with target groups of all partners; 2. Joint good practise examples booklet (~ 5 examples of each partner organisation, the amount of material will be specified during development); Materials will be made printable and available online for public free of charge at the project partners' we bites; - local seminars in all partner countries, except Latvia (7 in total) within last months of the project where project results will be presented to a broader audience; - a conference in Latvia at the end of the project to present project results to target groups and stakeholders and to to draw public attention to the role and importance of the cultural heritage; - other dissemination activities organised (information about project in project partner web sites, Facebook, media etc.); - expanded network of European organisations representing UNESCO recognised ICH elements. As a result of the project the following impact on the target groups is expected: - Staff of the partner organisational events in all partner countries. Impact different perspectives and exchange classroom techniques/ methodology/ approaches by participating in Short-term joinst staff training events in all partner countries. The education of practitioners of ICH will be improved directly through such project activities as created educational

In what way is the project innovative and/or complementary to other projects already carried out by the participating organisations?

This project is innovative in many ways due to the diversity of countries involved and each country's and organization's approach to ICH and their work with adult learners. This project will enable partners to learn the methods and experiences of other countries and to create new innovative methods to improve the work with their target groups. The project envisages to educate practitioners of ICH and people interested in it about the potential of intangible cultural heritage in various fields - this heritage is a value in itself and must be transfered to the next generations, but it also have major economic and social impacts, especially in rural areas of Europe. The project will also provide an opportunity to draw conclusions on the role that cultural heritage can play within sustainable urban development. The project will benefit local economies of JCH. The network of UNESCO - united organisations will give the unique opportunity to join different people from very different countries and cultures to promote significant part of European cultural heritage. The public authorities in the field of ICH, organisations (adult educators) and practitioners of ICH as well as many associated project partners working in the field of ICH - stakeholders at all levels- will be involved in one large network. This approach is innovative in the field of ICH.



How did you choose the project partners and what will they bring to the project? Does it involve organisations that have never previously been involved in a Strategic Partnerships project?

This project will be a logical continuation of the Erasmus + programme project "The Network of UNESCO recognised values" where four of this project partners (Latvia, Estonia - Kihnu, Georgia and North Macedonia) were involved and which focused on musical heritage in partner countries. New project will give the opportunity to expand the existing network, by attracting new partners and to explore other UNESCO-recognised values in all partner countries. Latvian organisation has had previous cooperation experience in other international projects with both Estonian partners. Other partners were found in the UNESCO network - through web site searching for organisations presenting similar cultural values and facing similar difficulties and challenges in the field of ICH and also taking into account the recommendations of other project partners, who had previous successful cooperation with these organisations. Organisations, involved in project, are from different countries, different size and scope. Differences among organizations is an advantage, as it will be an opportunity to look at the intangible cultural heritage from the perspective of different parties and to share examples of good practice and educational methods from different organizations. A partner from the Erasmus + programme Partner country is involved in the project - Georgian Arts and Culture Center, representing Georgian ICH, as this is a country where the ICH is preserved particularly successfully - not only on stage or in archives as is the case in many countries, but it is actively practised and promoted on a daily basis - in families and communities. That is why the example of Georgia is particularly important for other partners.

LATVIA: ECC Suiti in the project will be a Coordinating partner as in the previous Erasmus+ joint project "The Network of UNESCO recognised values";

ESTONIA: Kihnu Cultural Space has had previous cooperation experience with other project partners in several projects, including previous Erasmus+ project "The Network of UNESCO recognised values";

GEORGIA: Georgian Arts & Culture Center Foundation was one of the partners of previous Erasmus+ project "The Network of UNESCO recognised values";

NORTH MACEDONIA: The National Committee of The ICTM of Macedonia Skopje was one of the partners of previous Erasmus+ project "The Network of UNESCO recognised values";

ITALY: UNIVERSITA DEGLI STUDI DI CAGLIARI (University of Cagliari) is a new partner in the network although Georgian partner has had previous successful cooperation and Italy's partner was recommended as as an active organization in the promotion of ICH and adult education.

ESTONIA: NGO's Setomaa Tourism has had previous cooperation experience with other project partners from Latvia and Estonia in several projects, for example, INTERREG Estonian-Latvian progamme projects;

CROATIA: Gacko pucko otvoreno uciliste Otocac a new partner in the network although North Macedonian partner has had previous successful cooperation and Croatia's partner was recommended as as an active organization in the promotion of ICH and adult education.

PORTUGAL: Munícipio de Idanha-a-Nova is a new partner in the network although Georgian partner has had previous successful cooperation and Portugal's partner was recommended as as an active organization in the promotion of ICH and adult education.

All project partners are organizations with many years of experience in implementing various projects and activities and all, except Croatian partner, have previous experience of transnational cooperation projects as well.



How will the tasks and responsibilities be distributed among the partners?

All organisations are equal partners in the project and all jointly took part in preparation of this application form. All partners will be fully involved in all phases of the project. The representatives of each organisation will actively take part in all planned activities. All partners will be responsible for: - local project management; - creation of educational materials (Summary of methodologies and approaches, Good practise examples booklet) and translation in English; - organising of joint staff training event in each partner's country for project partners to share ideas, methods and good practises in teaching and informing practitioners of ICH in different ways; - preparing and sending participants to staff training events in other countries; - organising of local seminar and other local events for target groups to promote project results - educational materials - as well as share good practises acquired from other project partners (in all partner countries, except Latvia); - disseminating the project activities and results in local, national and international level. In addittion, the coordinating organisation from Latvia will be responsible for : - overall project management process in all phases - administrative process, financial organisation and reporting, in close cooperation with project partners; - organising of conference at the end of the project; - management and layout of education materials created during the project.

If relevant, please identify and explain the involvement of associated partners, not formally participating in the project. Please explain how they will contribute to the implementation of specific project tasks/activities or support the dissemination and sustainability of the project.

Several organisations will be involved in the project as associated partners at all stages of the project especially while organising Short-term joint staff training events in partner countries as well as for the dissemination of project results. The Latvian National Commission for UNESCO represents State interests at UNESCO and formulates and approves action plans for implementing UNESCO programmes in Latvia. Latvian National Centre for Culture is a public authorities responsible for ICH of Latvia. In the project these organisations will provide support to the Coordinating partner at all stages of the project in order to strengthen the network . They will support local project activities in Latvia - by presenting to project partners the summary of Latvia's national support system for intangible cultural heritage as well as advising the Coordinating partner on the implementation of the project activities throughout the project. Associated partner from Georgia - Tbilisi State Conservatoire and its International research Center for Traditional polyphony will support Short-term joint staff training event ir Georgia, by presenting project partners the traditional musical heritage of Georgia, as well as providing advisory support to the Georgian partner. Associated partner from Croatia - Croatian Commission for UNESCO will support local project activities in Croatia- by presenting to project activities by helping Kihnu Cultural Space Foundation to host project partners in Kihnu island and organize training event. Two associated partners from Sardegna in Italy - Association Tenores Sardegna and Istituto Superiore Regionale Etnografico will support project activities during Short-term joint staff training event in Sardegna, by introducing to project partners UNESCO-recognised element "Canto a tenore, Sardinian pastoral songs".

- During the project 7 joint staff training events will be organised in all partner countries. Participants in these events will be staff and members of the organisations involved in work with direct project target group - practitioners of ICH in each country. The staff selected to participate in staff training events during the project will meet the following criteria: English language skills at least at a basic level; commitment to the project (staff currently working directly with the target group); previous contribution to the activities of organisations.

- Transnational project meetings will be organised in all partner countries once in ~6 months during the project, in total 5 times during the project; participants of these meetings will be participating organisation project management groups - 2 persons from each organisation;

- In each country, except Latvia, at the end of the project a local seminars will be organised to inform target groups and other stakeholders about the progress of the project and project results. These seminars will be organized in 6 partner countries (7 events in total - 2 in Estonia);

- At the end of the project a conference will be organised in Latvia by the Coordinating partner ECC Suiti to present project results to target groups and stakeholders and to to draw public attention to the role and importance of the cultural heritage.

Preparation

Please describe what will be done in preparation by your organisation/group and by your partners/group before the actual project activities take place, e.g. administrative arrangements, communication about the activities, selection of the persons, coaches, involvement of stakeholders, etc.

Preparation for the project had already started at the end of last year and it has been an ongoing process ever since the last activities of previous Erasmus+ programme project "The Network of UNESCO recognised values", which ended in February 2020 and where four of this project partners were involved. The preparation activities included regular contacts via e-mails, social networks and Skype meeting, getting to know new partners, dividing responsibilities and tasks, preparing timetable, dissemination plan etc.

Each partner regularly evaluates its previous work with the target groups, the results achieved and the necessary actions in the future. This analysis of each organisation's needs has already made it possible, together with partner organisations, to define precisely the content of this strategic partnership project and the results to be achieved.

The success of the project depends on how much the target groups, staff and other stakeholders are involved in it in all project phases. In the project planning phase:

- partner organisations have informed their staff and learners about the project - project aims, activities and results;

- organisations have created the project team - local project management group and persons, who will be involved in the creation of the educational materials;

- staff members have made internal workplan of the project, agreed on tasks of each member, project timetable etc.;

- all organizations jointly took part in preparation of this application, taking into account each organisation's scope and specifics; they have planned together joint project activities as well as activities organised on local level.

Coordinating organization - ECC Suiti - which is financed mostly by 3 municipalities of Suiti region (Alsunga, Kuldīga and Ventspils municipalities) and other members - has informed the members of the foundation about the project and agreed on the project financing plan. In addition to this staff from ECC Suiti Māra Rozentāle has attended Erasmus+ seminar in Belgium in December 2019 (theme: Active Citizenship in Adult Education), thus gaining new knowledge of Erasmus + programme and experience of other organizations in project implementation.

All other organisations participating in a project, before the project was submitted, have signed a mandate to confer the coordinating organisation responsibility of acting as main beneficiary and have demonstrated their commitment to implement the project according to this application form.

All project partners have created project management teams, consisting of 2 persons from each organisation experienced with project coordination and finances. They will be responsible for overall project coordination and financial management. The salaries for project management teams will be financed from the budget line "Project Management and Implementation". Project management teams will participate in Transnational project meetings - 5 times during the project and will coordinate local project activities. There will be constant contact of project partners between the project meetings via e-mail, social networks and Skype thus, the successful implementation of the project will be ensured. Project Management

How will the monitoring of the project activities be carried out and by whom?

The responsibility for the monitoring of the progress and quality of the project activities throughout all its stages will be shared equally among partners, although the Coordinating Partner will have particular responsibilities for all project management. The staff of Coordinating partner have many years of experience in the successful implementation of numerous projects, including international and also as a lead partner.

At the beginning of the project all partners will sign Partnership agreements with the Coordinating partner. It will set out the obligations, commitments, rights, project financing and other issues of the parties. Thus, each partner will take responsibility for their contribution to the project.

Self-evaluation of all partner organizations, staff and other stakeholders will be provided throughout whole project through Evaluation questionnaires to monitor the activities - prepared by all participants from partner organisations after each transnational project meeting, staff training event and conference; the results of these questionnaires will be summarized and analyzed by each project partner's management group, responsible for each event in order to give an idea of the quality of the activities.

During each transnational project meeting a discussion is planned among partners to get feedback of organized activities and to improve the content and quality of the following events. A discussion will be organized during the conference in Latvia at the end of the project in order to evaluate the project progress and results.

How will you assess the success of your project?

Project success will be assessed by Evaluation questionnaires during the project to monitor the activities - prepared by all participants from partner organisations after each transnational project meeting and staff training event and conference in Latvia; the summarized and analyzed results of these questionnaires will give an idea to partner organisations of the project's success as well as will help to improve their future activities.

During the conference in Latvia at the end of the project a discussion will be organised to assess the progress of the project, its results and outcomes and possible further cooperation among the project partners.

In the last phase of the project local seminars in all partner countries will be organised (except in Latvia, where a conference will be organized) where project results will be presented to a broader audience and project success will be discussed with practitioners of ICH.

The aims of the evaluation of the project are:

- to give an idea of what extent and in what quality the project had been completed;

- to identify the impact of the project on the target groups;

- to analyze the project methodology in order to draw conclusions about what could be improved in future cooperation projects.



What are your plans for handling risks which could happen during the project (e.g. delays, budget, conflicts, etc.)?

During the project planning phase all possible project risks have been identified and analyzed:

-The risk of postponing and relocating project activities, taking into account this year's global health situation (related to COVID19 developments). All project activities will be organized in close cooperation with the Erasmus+ National Agency, and, in case of emergency, the most favorable solutions for the project will be sought together. The global situation is monitored actively and partners have agreed on other solutions for starting the project, for example, first transnational project meeting could be postponed or organized online. Each partner has assessed the health situation in their country and taken responsibility for their project activities and financial part;

- Financial risks. The coordinating organisation is financed basically by its members - private persons and 3 municipalities of Suiti region. These municipalities - members of the organisation (Alsunga, Kuldīga and Ventspils municipalities) will provide the pre-financing and, if neccessary, co-financing of the project costs, thus minimizing the risk. ECC Suiti has already ensured successful project financing in this way in several previous projects, including Erasmus+ program project. Other partners are organizations with long years of experience and a sufficient turnover to ensure the pre-financing part of the project cost;

- Administrative risks. Project's duration is 2 years, it is long enough to consider the risk of changes of the project management staff in partner organizations. To minimize this risk each organisation has created project management team, consisting of at least 2 persons from each organisation. All activities in the project will be documented (minutes of the meetings, programs of training activities, information in partner websites, photos etc.), it will ensure the successful progress of the project and high quality project results.

- Project time schedule risk. To minimize the risk, time schedule has planned carefully and realistically, in coordination with partners and providing some extra time for each activity and project activities planned to be implemented independently of each other;

-Conflicts among project partners. To avoid this risk at the begginning of the project all partners will sign Partnership agreements with the Coordinating partner. It will set out the obligations, commitments, rights, project financing and other issues of the parties, including conflict resolution arrangements.

Other potential risks of the project is found to be of minor importance. During the project permanent monitoring and controlling of the risks will be provided by all project partners.



Implementation

Please explain how will the project activities lead to the achievement of the project objectives and delivery of the planned results.

The main objective of the project is to promote the education of adult educators working in the field of intangible cultural heritage (ICH) of seven European countries as well as the education of practitioners of UNESCO-related elements thus safeguarding and promoting these European cultural values. The main task of the project is to explore the best ways and methods to channel the knowledge to those who need it - people practising UNESCO included traditions.

All project activities will ensure the achievement of these goals. Most important activities in the project are 7 Short-term joinst staff training events, planned in all partner countries, in total 192 mobilities are planned in the project. Thus staff of the participating organisations will exchange methods and best practices in the field of ICH thus building their own capacity to work with adult learners. Each of the 7 four days-long training events will be organized with the involvement of organizations at all levels in each country - partner organizations, as well as responsible institutions at regional and national level thus thus, partners will be provided with a comprehensive description of the situation in the field of ICH in each country. For partnering organizations this project will be opportunity to network at a transnational level, exchange of best practice supporting organisational learning. The program of each event is planned to be diverse, including both theoretical presentations and practical classes, workshops, master classes, etc.

The education of practitioners of ICH will be improved indirectly - through capacity building of the partner organisations - adult educators and directly through such project activities as: - created educational materials (The Summary of methodologies and approaches working with target groups of all partners and Joint good practise examples booklet);

- conference in Latvia at the end of the project (planned in August 2022);

- local seminars in other partner countries, planned at the last quarter of the project (7 seminars in total).

Various dissemination activities are planned in the project such as publicity activities, seminars in partner countries and conference in Latvia - thus, the delivery of the planned project results will be ensured.



How will you communicate and cooperate with your partners?

From the very beginning of project activities all the partners have agreed on how communication will be provided to ensure smooth progress of the project. Throughout the project several communication and cooperation tools will be used among all partners:

- regular contact through e-mails and phone calls;
- regular contact in project's Facebook profile forum, chat, pictures, videos etc.;
- partner meetings via Skype as required 1-2 times between transnational project meetings;
- transnational project meetings 5 times during the project.

In addition, online tools (Google drive) - cloud storage provider for a file-sharing service will be used to ensure all information about project activities securely available to all project partners in one place.

English will be the working language of the partnership, as all partners are fully involved in the preparation of project application form, there has been no communication problems among the partners during the project preparation phase. Therefore, this should not be the case with the project. Each organisation will prepare their participants for project activities by improving their language and communication skills as a well as will present the programs of the events and each country's national specifics and cultural environment. Other relevant stakeholders will be informed about project activities by publications – in project partner websites, Facebook profiles, media and information about project during local activities in each project partner organisation.

Activity Description (including profile of participants per organisation, goals and results of the activity)

The training event will be hosted by The National Committee of The International Council of Traditional Music of Macedonia Skopje. The program of the event is planned diverse, including presentations about Intangible Cultural Heritage of North Macedonia, focusing on UNESCO-recognised values (Glasoechko, male two-part singing in Dolni Polog; Kopachkata, a social dance from the village of Dramche, Pijanec; Feast of the Holy Forty Martyrs in Štip and other) and presentation about host partner's methodology and work with target groups - practitioners of ICH as well as practical workshops, trainings and field visits in order to explore the best practises of the educational work with the practitioners of ICH in the region and UNESCO included sites and ICH elements.

- presentations about national system for the protection of ICH in Republic of N. Macedonia, presented by UNESCO Macedonian National Commission, Institute for folklore "Marko Cepenkov" and Cultural Heritage Protection Office;

- presentations of the ICTM National Committee of Macedonia about its work with the target groups focusing on activities which contributes to the safeguarding and promoting of the Intangible cultural heritage with special focus on traditional music and dance elements;

- presentation of the Association of citizens "Kopachka" from Delchevo about its work with the local community of Pijanec focusing on activities for safeguarding and promoting the Kopahckata - a social dance from the village of Dramche, Delchevo, inscribed on the UNESCO ICH list in 2014 and other ICH elements of the region on local, national and international level;

- presentation of the Folk dance group "Izvor" - Jegunovce and Trio Gavrovski focusing on activities for safeguarding and promoting of the Glasoechko - male two part singing inscribed on the UNESCO ICH list in 2015 other ICH elements of the region on local, national and international level;

- presentation of UNESCO included element "Kopachkata - a social dance from the village of Dramche, Delchevo and other traditional songs, instruments and dances from the region presented by the local dance group "Pijanechki glas", "Kopachka", "Kitka - Istibanja" and individual players and singers.

- presentation and practical workshop on Kopahckata a social dance from the village of Dramche, Delchevo, inscribed on the UNESCO ICH list in 2014;
- presentation and practical workshop on making and playing traditional musical instrument kjemene (strung bowed instrument) and traditional local drone singing;
- presentation and practical workshops on local traditional cuisine and handicrafts;
- field visit to Dolni Polog region for presentation of Glasoechko male two part singing inscribed on the UNESCO ICH list in 2015;

- field visit to Skopje old Bazaar, recognized cultural space in the state capital, and Ohrid and Ohrid region as a World heritage site and cultural space in order to explore good examples of different contexts of multiethnic cultural spaces with different and rich cultural heritage forms mutually shared and safeguarded.

Participants in the event will be staff of seven other partner organisations (4 persons from each partner), 28 mobilities in total, plus local participants from host organisation. Participants will be issued certificates of participation by the host partner.

The aim of this teaching training event is the exchange of views, opinions and experiences in the field of ICH in North Macedonia focusing on UNESCO-recognised values. During the training event, in cooperation with North Macedonia's public authorities responsible for ICH, the national ICH support system of North Macedonia will be presented to the participants. As a result participants will gain fresh ideas, different perspectives and exchange classroom techniques/ methodology/ approaches thus building their capacity in their daily work with adult learners - practitioners of ICH.

Background Information

What is the added value of these Learning, Teaching or Training activities (including long-term activities) with regards to the achievement of the project objectives?

The most important part of the project is international exchanges of views, opinions and experiences among project partners both relating to good educational practices in general and on how to satisfy the needs of bearers of ICH in their respective countries.

During the project 7 joint partner organisation staff training events will be organised in all partner countries (1 event in Estonia hosted by both Estonian partners) in order to exchange methods and best practices among participating organizations and countries. Certificates of attendance will be issued by host partner to all participants of training events thus proving their participation in the events, as well as Europass Mobility documents (except local participants).

In training events partners, in cooperation with each country's public authorities involved in this field, will exchange the information about national ICH support systems in partner countries. It will make it possible to compare these systems and evaluate their effectiveness and impact on target groups in different countries. And partners will get acquainted with the activities of other organizations working in the field of ICH and adult education, thus building their own capacity to work with adult learners.

There will be differennt benefits for participants of the events:

- improved English language and communication skills;

- a better understanding of ICH in general and approach to it in different countries;
- increased capacity to organize events ans solve practical issues;
- active sharing of new methods and approaches in the field of ICH.

As a result of the training events staff of the partner organisations - adult educators - who will gain fresh ideas, different perspectives and exchange classroom techniques/ methodology/ approaches. Impact on partnering organisations will be as well: opportunity to network at a transnational level, exchange of best practice supporting organisational learning.

Thus the main project aim will be acvieved: promoted education of adult educators working in the field of intangible cultural heritage (ICH) of seven European countries as well as the education of practitioners of UNESCO-related elements thus safeguarding and promoting these European cultural values.



How will you select, prepare and support participants and ensure their safety? Please describe the practical arrangements including training, teaching or learning agreements, if applicable.

The project partners have agreed on the criteria for selecting participants for the activities. Participants of training events will be staff and members of the organisations involved in work with direct project target group - adult learners - the practitioners of ICH. These participants will be involved in other project activities as well - creation of materials, organizing of local seminars, publicity of the project etc. Participants are expected to carry out dissemination activities after the events.

The staff selected to participate in training events will meet the following criteria:

- good English language and communication skills at least at a basic level;

- the involvement in local project activities;

- the work so far have been related to the target group of the project.

Each sending organisation will provide the insurance for the participants before each trip. In addition, a detailed programme of the events, accommodations, travel arrangements etc. information will be presented to the participants before the trip. If neccessary, each organisation will provide short English language training course for the participants to improve their communication skills thus ensuring their full and qualitative participation in the training events. The safety of the participants is very important, especially, taking into account recent outbreak of Covid-19 pandemic. This issue also will be particularly discussed with the participants.

In total 192 EUROPASS MOBILITY documents will be issued.
